



How to Get Your Child Covered by MICHild or Healthy Kids

MICHild and Healthy Children are Medicaid programs that insure children (ages 0-19) who have no other form of insurance. Both cover many services, including regular checkups, shots, emergency care, dental care, prescription medications, vision care, and more.

Healthy Kids

For a child under the age of one to qualify for Healthy Kids, the family's income can be up to 185 percent of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL), or \$2,660 a month for a family of three.

For children age 1-19, the income can be up to 150 percent of the FPL, or \$2,157 a month for a family of three.

There are no premiums or deductibles for Healthy Kids, but some plans may include small copays.

MICHild

MICHild covers children from families whose income is just a little too high to qualify for Healthy Kids. For children under the age of one, family income must be between 185 percent and 200 percent of the FPL, or from \$2,661 to \$2,875 a month for a family of three.

For children 1 to 19, the total must be more than 150 percent but no more than 200 percent of the FPL.

The monthly premium is \$10, even if you have more than one child enrolled. There are no co-pays or deductibles.
